Housing Supports

Ethnos Canada provides housing for all students, domestic and international. The housing fees are included in the tuition that is paid, no additional fees are collected. We currently maintain 14 apartments which are comprised of four four-bedroom apartments, eight two-bedroom apartments, and two three-bedroom apartments.

Discrimination Policy

As a registered Canadian charity operating in the province of Ontario, and respecting the Biblical mandate to honour governmental authorities (Romans 13:1-7), Ethnos Canada recognizes the injunction in the Ontario Human Rights Code regarding discrimination; to wit: “Every person has a right to equal treatment with respect to employment without discrimination because of race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, ethnic origin, citizenship, creed, sex, sexual orientation, age, record of offences, marital status, family status or disability.” [Section 5.(1)]

Ethnos Canada also acknowledges that the Code includes the following clause permitting exemption under certain circumstances: “The right under section 5 to equal treatment with respect to employment is not infringed where, (a) a religious [or] philanthropic... organization that is primarily engaged in serving the interests of persons identified by their race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, ethnic origin, creed, sex, age, marital status or disability employs only, or gives preference in employment to, persons similarly identified if the qualification is a reasonable and bona fide qualification because of the nature of the employment.” [Section 24.(1)]

Ethnos Canada is a religious organization whose mandate is to proclaim the Biblical Gospel of Jesus Christ, plant and nurture Christian churches, and translate the Bible into the indigenous languages of people groups around the world. Our ministries involve the mobilization and training of missionaries, are staffed only by persons who are recommended to us by evangelical Christian churches, and are financed individually via the specifically designated donations of churches and individuals.

Furthermore Ethnos Canada understands the Bible to declare that any sexual activity other than heterosexual within the bounds of marriage to be acts of sin.

Ethnos Canada will not discriminate against persons seeking training or employment on the basis of race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, ethnic origin, citizenship, sex, age, record of offences, marital status, family status or disability. However persons seeking training or employment with Ethnos Canada must accept and agree to uphold the organization’s doctrinal statement and must not engage in sexual activity declared to be sin by the Bible.

Ethnos Canada will not automatically reject applications for training and/or employment submitted by persons with disabilities, although the nature of most ministry positions within the organization greatly reduces the possibility of their being staffed by persons with physical or mental handicaps. Ethnos Canada will carefully consider each applicant to determine whether there might be opportunities for service despite the disability and will endeavour to place the applicant, provided they meet the other regular conditions for acceptance.

Ethnos Canada will do all that it can to accommodate employees who become disabled, if necessary seeking alternate service positions wherein they may continue to serve despite their disability.
